Resolution 11 in Support of Retaining Gifted and Talented Programs in District 20.

WHEREAS on January 13, 2021 the Department of Education of the City of New York announced that they will end all existing Gifted and Talented programs after this year.

WHEREAS there has been no information provided as to how these programs will be re-imagined so as to serve the needs of the students currently in these programs or of future students in District 20.

WHEREAS there are currently 8 schools with G&T programs in District 20, more than any other district in the city (per 2020 NYC DOE G&T Admissions Guide).

WHEREAS the lack of transparency in this decision during a pandemic is irresponsible, and does not take into account the needs of all students in District 20.

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED AND DECREED that the District 20 Community Education Council calls upon the Chancellor and Mayor, as well as local officials and community leaders, to:

- 1. Rescind this decision to cancel the G&T program after this year.
- 2. To retain the current G&T program until a well-defined and well disseminated replacement is presented to parents across the city and successfully implemented by the incoming Mayor and Chancellor.
